Walk Length - 4.5 km

Starting Point - African Burial Ground - Duane Street at Elk Street  
Nearest Subway - City Hall - Brooklyn Bridge (Lines 4,5,6)

**Directions**

Start at the corner of Duane and Elk streets, facing the African Burial Memorial (The building directly to the right of the memorial at 290 Broadway has a fascinating exhibition highlighting the significance of the site) 1

Facing the memorial, turn left on Duane Street, cross over Foley Square and take a left onto Centre Street – the US Courthouse will be on your right. Turn right onto Broome Street and go one and a half blocks. Stand on the opposite side of the road to number 375 (which is currently above a bakery) and look up to the very top of the building 2

Turn around and walk back along Broome street as far as the corner of Mulberry Street. Stop at Umberto's Clam House which is on your right 3

Turn left onto Mulberry Street. Continue until you get to Bayard Street which you turn left onto. Then take the first right onto Mott Street, then the first left onto Pell Street and then the first right onto Doyers Street. Walk along Doyers Street until you get to the bend 4

Continue round the bend to the end of the street. You will come out at a crossroads. Turn left onto Bowery and then right onto Canal Street. Continue along Canal Street, passing the Mahayana Temple on your left and turn right onto Eldridge Street. Stop outside the Synagogue hidden amongst the Chinese shops about 20 metres down on your left 5

Walk back up Eldridge Street and turn right back onto Canal Street. Take a left onto Orchard Street and continue all the way to the end of the street. Turn right onto East Houston Street then almost immediately left onto Avenue A. Walk up Avenue A for six blocks until you reach Tompkins Square Park. Cut diagonally through the park to its centre then walk north to the public toilets at the parks top edge. Between the entrances to the toilets is a small children's play area. Enter this and stop at the fountain directly in front of you 6

Turn around and exit the children's area, turn right and walk to the edge of the park, once there turn left and then turn right to walk along St Marks Place. Turn left onto 2nd Avenue and one block later turn right onto East 7th Street. Stop outside McSorley's Old Ale House which is at the end of the block on your right 7
