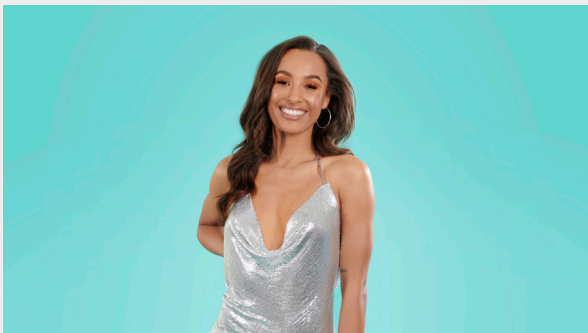




Ready to Mingle: No Filter
